## MiChart and MBECT Enrollment

We have been diligently working with the Revenue Cycle Team to rectify enrollment issues related to MBECT and the MiChart system. We are happy to announce that MBECT enrollment has been completely loaded into MiChart as of September 6th, 2012! We are encouraged this will improve enrollment issues related to MiChart. The Revenue Cycle Team has worked very hard to manually load an additional 34 studies which had enrollment but were not in the MiChart system.

Just a reminder the Research Medical Record Number (RMRN) is the replacement for the 7000 account. The RMRN is provided once the RSH (Medical Record) is created in MiChart. CRAO has eliminated the need for Study Team Members to enter skeletal studies in MBECT for enrollment purposes! We have hired two temporary staff who will be entering the previously approved Excel billing calendar versions into MBECT (a requirement of the MiChart billing system). We still have about 700 to go so if you do NOT have your enrollment in MBECT, you may enter a full protocol or simply create a Skeletal study so you can enroll your subjects in MBECT as required.

When the Billing Calendar Preparers get to your study, they will "finish" the calendar/protocol on your behalf and notify you when it is completed. You will then be able to review and revise prior to the final upload into eResearch. MiChart only recognizes the MBECT calendar format and this is a vital step to compliance.
